FINANCIAL REPORT

This year Glenn Evans, K7GLE, after several years of serving as Secretary-Treasurer, decided to step down. We would like to thank him for his contributions over the years and for helping make the transition to Aaron Hulett, K8AMH, a smooth experience.

Post-transition, Aaron will begin working on importing our financial information into QuickBooks, and using laser checks to both streamline using QuickBooks to record payments and help present a more professional image. Treasurer Reports will be generated each month and include a Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss statement so that Board members, PSRG members and the public can review our Group's finances.

This fiscal year, which ran from May 1, 2015 to April 30, 2016, we had a net income of \$322.17 for a year-end balance of \$3,083.98. Our BECU Checking and Savings account balances were \$888.22 and \$1,959.93, respectively, and our PayPal account was at \$231.83. We also have \$4.00 at CafePress that will be paid out when the total meets their current payout threshold.


